

DAILY TIMETABLE & ACTIVITIES

What does a typical day look like?

- 8:00am Buses depart Moggill Uniting Church (note new departure venue)
- 8:30am Bus departs Mt Crosby State School
- 9:00am Assembly – singing, drama, memory verse
- 9:45am Team devotions
- 10:00am Morning tea
- 10:15am-2:15pm Team time which may include:
 - Kayaking
 - Gunyah building
 - Cooking lunch
 - Games, soccer, other outdoor activities
 - Hat decorating
 - Craft
 - Jumping castle / rock wall
 - Mud / water games
- 2:15pm Afternoon assembly – war cries, memory verses, team prizes, singing
- 3:00pm Close and buses depart
- 3:15pm Bus arrives Mt Crosby State School
- 3:30-3:45pm Buses arrive Moggill Uniting Church

What types of activities happen?
